

**CLAYTON COUNTY RECOGNIZES
THE TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL
DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.
PRAYER BREAKFAST**

- WHEREAS:** Twenty-two years ago in January 1992, The Concerned Black Citizens Coalition of Clayton County initiated a Prayer Breakfast in Jonesboro, Georgia to honor the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; and
- WHEREAS:** Dr. King is recognized for his symbolic leadership and remarkable efforts during the American Civil Rights Movement, representing one of the most influential and powerful orators for peace, equality and human rights; and
- WHEREAS:** Dr. King was a native Georgian and graduate of Morehouse College and Boston University. Recipient of honorary degrees, hundreds of awards, and the prestigious Noble Peace Prize, Dr. King was the founder and president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference that uses principles of non-violent resistance to stop racial injustice in the nation and around the world; and
- WHEREAS:** Dr. King is remembered as a prominent activist for his vision on justice and freedom, directing the August 28, 1963 March on Washington, D.C., of 250,000 people to whom he delivered the famous and inspiring speech, "I Have a Dream"; and
- WHEREAS:** The Concerned Black Citizens Coalition of Clayton County, a viable civic organization of Clayton County, is recognized for its work in keeping the dream of freedom, justice and equality alive through sponsorship and support of the annual Clayton County Martin Luther King, Jr. Prayer Breakfast; and
- WHEREAS:** The Twenty-Second Annual Clayton County Martin Luther King, Jr. Prayer Breakfast will be held on Saturday, January 19, 2013, at 8:00 a.m. at the Travelers Rest Missionary Baptist Church in Morrow, Georgia; now
- THEREFORE:** I, GAIL B. HAMBRICK, Commissioner, on behalf of the Clayton County Board of Commissioners, do hereby recognize and honor The Concerned Black Citizens Coalition of Clayton County for its continued efforts in acknowledging and supporting the pivotal teachings and leadership of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
