

# Spraying Schedule



The county will be sprayed by commission districts area. Districts areas 1 and 3 are sprayed the first week and then Districts areas 2 and 4 the following week. The pattern is repeated every two (2) weeks, and only unincorporated areas of the county will be sprayed.

This schedule is also dependent on the weather as we are not able to spray in heavy rain, but rain-outs will be made-up whenever possible, in high wind (above 10mph), and in extreme heat (above 100°). The spray schedule will continue as noted and missed areas will be sprayed as soon as possible.

The county will start its spraying schedule on April 1<sup>st</sup> or when the temperature reaches and stays above at least 70°, and will end on September 30<sup>th</sup>.

## Tips for Mosquito Control

---

- Eliminate standing water
- Trim back vegetation
- Remove yard debris
- Mow your lawn weekly
- Consider planting flowers that deter mosquitoes such as Lemon Grass, Marigold and Rosemary
- Do not leave out pet food

## Mosquito Bite Tips


- Try an Antihistamine cream to help the itch and swelling
- Home remedies include: honey, basil, aspirin, Listerine, and hand sanitizer.
- Don't scratch it. Cover the bite with a bandage to discourage scratching.
- If you are having a serious allergic reaction to the bite seek medical attention right away.
