Saturday voting will take place on **July 16th** from 9am to 4pm.









Animal Control Unit

Barking Dog Complaint Procedures

- Advise the owner of the complaint, either verbally or in writing.
- Start keeping a documented log that includes date, time and duration of the problem. This must be kept for 10 days or 10 incidents.
- Come to the Animal Control Facility to report the incident. You will be required to complete a written statement. Make sure you include a description of the dog(s) and the address of where the dog(s) are located.
- A citation will be issued to the owner based on your documentation and complaint.
- Your attendance will be **REQUIRED** in court at a later time.

Is It Legal To Tie My Dog Up?

On a running cable line or trolley system and only one animal may be attached to each running cable or trolley system, no animal may be attached to a running cable line or trolley system for more than 12 hours in a 24 hour period. No animal may be attached to a running cable line or trolley system between the hours of 10:00pm and 6:00 am. Dogs on running cables must have access to adequate shelter, food and water as required by Section 14-165 of this Code.

Clayton County has partnered with SeeClickFix to announce a new platform called "**Click Clayton**" that will allow citizens to report quality-of-life issues and request Clayton County services.

With free SeeClickFix mobile app and web tools, Clayton County citizens will now be able to provide Clayton County staff with pictures, videos, specific descriptions, and more — valuable information needed to get the job done efficiently. In addition, the SeeClickFix platform provides Clayton County officials with a centralized issue management system to manage issues from creation to resolution — engaging Clayton County citizens throughout the process.

The **Click Clayton** mobile app is available for download on [Android](#) and [iPhone](#). In addition to the mobile apps, citizens can send reports to [Clayton County's website](#) and [seeclickfix.com](#).

Services are for unincorporated Clayton County and do not include areas inside city limits.

Restrictive Parking Program

Purpose – In an effort to deter prohibited parking in accordance with the Clayton County Code of Ordinances, The Board of Commissioner’s approved a Restrictive Parking Program during their Regular Business Meeting of February 10, 2016 via [Resolution No. 2016-17](#). This program addresses the dangers and negative aesthetic impact of improperly parked vehicles on the rights-of-ways of roads, streets, thoroughfares, and other avenues of travel in the unincorporated areas of Clayton County. The process consists of submitting a petition requesting the placement of parking related signage. The petition process shall require a minimum of a ½ mile segment of street frontage or a full street, if the street is less than a ½ mile in length. Also, the Program requires 75% of the property owners in the impacted area sign the petition, and shall prohibit all parking on streets within the impacted area.

Step 1 – Citizen Inquiry for No Parking Restrictions. Citizens may complete an [Online Request Form](#) or contact the Clayton County Transportation and Development office at 770-477-3674 requesting a Petition.

- Citizen provides contact information, with the street, area or subdivision in which No Parking restrictions are desired to begin the petition process.

Step 2 – Clayton County staff begins the petition process including:

- Field Investigation of requested area.
- Creates a map indicating the requested area containing property limits.
- Designs sign layout identifying actual sign placement location within the requested area.
- Determines sign quantity and associated cost.
- Defines number of property owners necessary to meet 75% approval certification.
- Creates No Parking Restriction Petition.

Step 3 – County provides the Petition package to requesting citizen for processing of property owner signatures.

Step 4 – Citizen returns the completed petition to Clayton County Transportation and Development for property owner certification. If 75% or more verified property owners have signed the petition, proceed to Step 5. If less than 75% of verified property owners have signed the petition, modifications to the desired area can be considered, however the process starts over with Step 2.

Step 5 – Clayton County staff will advise citizen upon meeting the petition requirements to submit payment for sign fabrication and installation.

Step 6 – After all payments are received and certified, Clayton County will begin fabrication and installation of No Parking signage per the sign placement design. This process typically takes approximately two weeks.



Outdoor Water Wasters to Watch

- ✚ Don't over-water your lawn. As a general rule, lawns only need watering every 5 to 7 days in the summer. A hearty rain eliminates the need for watering for as long as two weeks.
- ✚ Buy a rain gauge to determine how much rain or irrigation your yard has received.
- ✚ Water lawns during early morning hours when temperatures and wind speed are the lowest. This reduces losses from evaporation.
- ✚ Don't water your street, driveway or sidewalk. Position your sprinklers so that your water lands on the lawn and shrubs and not the paved areas.
- ✚ Do not leave sprinklers or hoses unattended. Your garden hose can pour out 600 gallons or more in only a few hours. Use a kitchen timer to remind yourself to turn the water off.

Sheriff Victor Hill Orders Frequent "Quality Of Life" Sweeps For Clayton County

To maintain and increase further law and order in Clayton County, Sheriff Victor Hill has ordered frequent "Quality Of Life Sweeps" in addition to warrant round ups. These sweeps will target loud music, loitering, littering, panhandling, truancy, curfew, and disorderly house violations. These violations decrease the quality of life for hard working citizens, and leads to more serious crimes if allowed to fester unchecked.

Those transporting trash who allow it to fall off of their vehicles, illegally dump trash, or throw anything out of vehicles will be cited for littering which can carry up to a \$1,000.00 fine.

School is out, but children under the age of 18 must be home by 11pm Sunday through Thursday, and by 12 midnight Friday and Saturday.

Music from vehicles should not be audible more than 50 feet from the vehicle to comply with the county ordinance that can result in a fine up to \$1000.00. The Sheriff is asking parents to go over this with their children of driving age in order to avoid fines.

"Disorderly House" is another code section that the Sheriff's Office will be strictly enforcing. Homes where owners or renters allow any type of disorderly conduct that effects the quality of life in the neighborhood can face up to \$1000.00 fine.

Panhandling is another quality of life issue that the Sheriff's Office is working hard to remove from the county. Please keep in mind that some of these individuals that approach cars for money are involved in criminal activity and use the donated funds for those purposes instead of food and substance. Today a Sheriff's deputy stop a panhandler identified as Eric Burgess and discovered he was wanted for Simple Assault. He now faces the wall in Georgia's toughest para-military jail.


