ORDINANCE NO. 2014-59

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF CLAYTON COUNTY, GEORGIA, AS AMENDED, SPECIFICALLY, CODE OF CLAYTON COUNTY, GEORGIA, PART II, CHAPTER 2 "ADMINISTRATION", ARTICLE IV "PURCHASES AND PROPERTY", DIVISION 3 "PURCHASING PROCEDURES" BY AMENDING SECTION 2-145.5 "PURCHASING – SUPPLIER RELATIONSHIPS" ADDING SUBSECTION "(D) DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION"; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING LAWS, ORDINANCES, AND RESOLUTIONS; TO PROVIDE SEVERABILITY; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CLAYTON COUNTY**

**BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED**

Section 1. The Code of Clayton County, Georgia, as amended, is hereby further amended by amending Part II, Chapter 2 "Administration", Article IV "Purchases and Property", Division 3 "Purchasing Procedures", by amending Section 2-145.5 "Purchasing – Supplier Relationships" by adding Subsection "(d) Disclosure of Information" and which shall read as follows:

**"(d) *Disclosure of Information.*** To the extent permitted by law and the sections of this ordinance, no official, employee or agent shall disclose or use information, confidential or otherwise, concerning any official action or proposed official action, property, purchase, procurement bid, proposal, governing operations or affairs of the County unless such information is generally available to the public. Confidential information means any information which, by law or practice, is not available to the public. Further, no official or employee shall disclose or use confidential information concerning any offer, purchase, procurement bid, or proposal of or to the County to advance his own financial or private interests or those of another."


Section 2. All laws, ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. If any part of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect the remainder of this enactment, and such remainder shall remain in full force and effect.


Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its approval by the Board of Commissioners.

SO ORDAINED, this the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2014.




