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## Clayton County Prison 2015 Annual PREA Report

The Annual PREA Report for calendar year 2015, shows that this facility is continuing to strive for compliancy with all standards and expectation of the PREA Policy. Clayton County Prison houses, on average, a population of 232 inmates. The facilities mission is to utilize prison labor to successfully conduct and complete daily work production for the County. All daily projects initiatives are functionally grouped by the directives of the Board of Commissioners, Warden, Deputy Warden, and Departments within the community. All Staff and departmental personnel that work directly with Inmates of The Department of Corrections, have been properly trained and instructed on Standards of PREA.

During the 2015 PREA Year, there was one incident noted. The incident occurred on a work detail involving a contract employee. The employee was terminated by the Contract Department. Incident involved only misconduct and no criminal activity, therefore no criminal charges were warranted. Corrective actions provided to the Department involved proper notification to supervisors.

The review/inspection of the layout of the facility proved to be safe, with no improprieties or endangerments. Additions to the layout included an additional camera and mirror in the laundry. A MOU was initiated between Clayton County Prison and Southern Crescent Sexual Assault Advocacy Center. Each Inmate was documented with receiving the proper training on what PREA represents and on how to incorporate the standards into their protection and safety. All factors of safety and sanitation was found to be covered in the inspection of the building.

We are pleased with the overall results of the 2015 year and strive to maintain and improve in all future practices.
