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## **SLBE Program Expands**

Clayton County Central Services Department revises it's Small Local Business Enterprise Program (SLBE) Ordinance as of February 15, 2022. The program changes include expanding from six (6) counties to eleven (11). Along with Clayton County, the Program will now include Cherokee, Cobb, DeKalb, Douglas, Fayette, Fulton, Gwinnett, Henry, Rockdale, and Spalding Counties. Which means that businesses located in those counties can now apply for SLBE certification.

Additional program changes include increasing applicants eligible personal net worth cap from \$750,000 to \$1.32 Million.

## **Supplier Survey**

Central Services Department has created it's first official feedback questionnaire which can be located on the Clayton County's website under the Central Services Department's page. Any feedback from suppliers will help Central Services Department improve the supplier's Procurement experience with Clayton County.

The survey asks questions regarding procurement services as well as customer service skills provided by the Department. Suppliers answers are important and responses will be used to assist in the continuing efforts to improve programs and services provided.

## **New Initiatives**

#### Mentor Protégé Program

Clayton County Central Services has implemented a Mentor Protégé Program. The program was approved by the Board of Commissioners on February 15, 2022.

#### The program seeks to:

- Build capacity of local business
- Increase Access to Organizations
- Enhance Business Competencies

#### Minimum Program Qualification for Protégé

- Must be a certified SLBE with Clayton County
- Registered vendor with Clayton County
- In good standing- not on suspension or on Federal, State or Local Debarment lists
- Must be a for-profit business concern



#### **Memorandum of Understanding with Small Business Administration**

Clayton County has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Small Business Administration (SBA). The MOU allows for Clayton County to partner with SBA to provide resources to the small business community.

The MOU allows for dissemination of up-to-date information to the small business community regarding SBA's business development services, programs and services, sharing of access to resource partners, and speakers to participate in workshops, conferences, seminars and other activities to discuss SBA financing, government contracting and other business topics.





## **Opportunities**

Clayton County welcomes the opportunity to do business with you.

Before you engage in doing business with the County, be aware of solicitation limits by procurement methods.

The One (1) Quote procurement method is used when a purchase does not exceed \$5,000.00.

Three (3) Quotes are obtained for all purchase requests over the sum of \$5,001.00 and up to \$74,999.99

Request for Quotes (RFQ) may be used when a purchase request is a service such as installation or repairs, and is between \$5001.00 and \$74,999.99 and requires insurance. A contract will be attached to this type of procurement method. RFQ's will include a Solicitation form, Compliance requirements, Insurance requirements and requested form submittals, along with a copy of the draft contract.

Invitation to Bid (ITB) is a competitive sealed bid process for cost of Services \$75,000 or greater. Specifications are usually clear and defined and cost is the primary basis of the award.

Request for Proposal (RFP) is a competitive process used when the Sealed Bid method is not practical or advantageous. Cost is NOT the primary consideration. RFPs are usually used to procure service contracts, highly technical equipment, etc. This process requires an Evaluation Committee to review proposal submittals.
