RESOLUTION NO. 2025-34

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CLAYTON COUNTY, THROUGH CLAYTON COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION, TO ENTER INTO AN AMENDED COLLABORATION AGREEMENT WITH AMERICAN HEART ASSOCIATION, INC. TO OUTLINE THE ANTICIPATED ROLES, RESPONSIBILITIES AND JOINT ACTIVITIES TO INCREASE AWARENESS OF SUDDEN CARDIAC ARREST IN YOUTH SPORTS; TO AUTHORIZE THE CHAIRWOMAN TO PERFORM ALL ACTS NECESSARY TO ACCOMPLISH THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; TO AUTHORIZE THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER TO AMEND THE BUDGET TO REFLECT AN APPROPRIATE REVENUE SOURCE AND EXPENSE AS REQUIRED BY THE TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS RESOLUTION; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, American Heart Association, Inc. (“AHA”) is an organization that fights heart disease and seeks to increase awareness of sudden cardiac arrest in youth sports by spreading key campaign messaging around cardiac arrests, healthy lifestyles, and recognition of cardiovascular warning signs; and

WHEREAS, on December 17, 2024, the Board of Commissioners (“the Board”) approved Resolution 2024-278 authorizing the County through the Clayton County Department of Parks and Recreation (“the Department”) to collaborate with AHA to eliminate health disparities by improving the chances of survival and recovery for individuals who experience cardiac arrests and promote emergency preparedness; and

WHEREAS, AHA desires to increase operational expenses incurred with participating and completing the activities in the collaboration between the AHA and the Department by an additional \$2,000 to bring the total to \$11,000 to accomplish the goals of the Collaboration Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County deems it in the best interest of the County and the County will best be served by entering into an amended Collaboration Agreement with AHA to accept this additional funding to increase awareness of sudden cardiac arrest in youth sports, spread key campaign messaging around cardiac arrests, healthy lifestyles, and recognition of cardiovascular warning signs.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
OF CLAYTON COUNTY, GEORGIA AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners authorizes Clayton County, through the Department of Parks and Recreation, to enter into an amended Agreement with American Heart Association, Inc. for \$11,000.00 to outline the anticipated roles, responsibilities and joint activities between the AHA and the Department to increase awareness of sudden cardiac arrest in youth sports.

Section 2. The Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the Chairwoman to execute any documents and to otherwise perform all acts necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution.

Section 3. The Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the Chief Financial Officer to amend the Budget to reflect an appropriate revenue source and expense as required by the terms of the agreement.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be effective on the date of its approval by the Board of Commissioners.
