ORDINANCE NO. 2013 – 159

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF CLAYTON COUNTY, GEORGIA, AS AMENDED; SPECIFICALLY PART II, CHAPTER 70 “PERSONNEL”, ARTICLE I “IN GENERAL”, SECTION 70-3 “WORKERS’ COMPENSATION”; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING LAWS, ORDINANCES, AND RESOLUTIONS; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners deems it in the best interest of the County to amend the Code of Clayton County as hereinafter set forth.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
OF CLAYTON COUNTY, GEORGIA, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners hereby amends the Code of Clayton County, Georgia, as amended, by deleting Part II, Chapter 70, “Personnel”, Article I, “In General”, Section 70-3(g), “Workers’ Compensation” in its entirety and by replacing it with a new Section 70-3(g) which reads as follows:

**Sec. 70-3. Workers’ compensation.**

- (g) Any other unclassified civil service employee who is employed in a temporary, or part-time, or seasonal capacity, or is in a probationary status, and who is injured by accident arising out of and in the course of the employment (as defined under provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act) shall not receive 100 percent full salary but shall be paid in accordance with provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act. Provided however; this section shall not apply to a public safety employee who is presently in a temporary, or part-time, or seasonal capacity, or is presently in a probationary status and who suffers a compensable injury that results from the officer’s participation in a life saving event or when an officer suffers or has suffered a violent injury in the line of duty and said public safety employee is not presently receiving 100 percent full salary.


Section 2. In the event any section, paragraph, subpart, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of the Ordinance shall be declared or adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, such declaration or adjudication shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance which shall remain in full force and effect as if the portions declared invalid or unconstitutional had never been enacted into law.

Section 3. All laws, ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its approval by the Board of Commissioners.
