WHEREAS, the County deems it in the best interest of the County and the County will best be served by allowing the Host to facilitate this event.


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS


Section 2. This Resolution shall be immediately effective upon approval by the Board of Commissioners.
