ORDINANCE NO. 2019- 128

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CLAYTON COUNTY CIVIL SERVICE RULES AND REGULATIONS, AS AMENDED, SPECIFICALLY TO AMEND RULE 2.103 "MONTHLY MEETINGS" AND TO INSERT IN LIEU THEREOF NEW LANGUAGE AS PROVIDED HEREIN; TO REPEAL ANY AND ALL CONFLICTING LAWS, ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners adopted certain Civil Services Rules and Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners desires to amend the date that the Civil Service Board will meet to hold meetings; and

WHEREAS, the amendment of this rule attempts to decrease attorney conflicts and set Civil Service hearings at a time when other criminal and civil cases would not be held given that said criminal and civil cases have priority over Civil Service hearings; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners, with the approval of the Clayton County Civil Service Board, desires to amend said Rules and Regulations with regards to "Monthly Meetings."

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF  
CLAYTON COUNTY, GEORGIA, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED

Section 1. Clayton County Civil Service Rule 2.103 "Monthly Meetings" is hereby deleted in its entirety and inserted in lieu thereof language to read as follows:

**2.103 Monthly Meetings:** *The Board shall hold regularly scheduled monthly meetings on the fourth Wednesday of each month, provided that the Chairman may change the time, date and place of any meeting when deemed necessary and further provided that proper notification is given to concerned parties.*


Section 2. All Ordinances, Resolutions, Rules and Regulations, or parts thereof which conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. It is declared to be the intention of the Board of Commissioners that all sections and paragraphs of this Ordinance are or were, upon their enactment, believed to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the Board of Commissioners that the remaining portions of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable, and of full force and effect.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be effective on the date of its approval by the Board of Commissioners.






