

We are excited to implement a real-time crime center platform, develop recruitment and retention opportunities and pathways as well as expand partnerships with our businesses and non-profits.

Additionally, we recognize the direct and indirect challenges related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Working together, we provided resources to help residents maintain stable housing through the execution of the emergency rental and utility assistance program. FINANCE

- Awarded the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award from Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) for the current fiscal period and 20th consecutive year
- Awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for 43 consecutive years, the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting representing a significant accomplishment by a government
- General fund cash and reserve position increased between 2015 and 2022
- General fund balance increased significantly growing from 39.69% to 44.92% of general fund revenue between 2018 and 2022
- High quality credit Aa2 rating equivalent to the U.S. counties, median of Aa2



INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT

- Established a new Office of Digital Equity to help bridge the digital divide for Clayton County residents
- Launched new web site design and accessibility for compliance
- Replaced all network equipment in the Justice Center and Juvenile Court buildings
- Enhanced cybersecurity posture by implementing software to minimize risk to the county's data and network systems



TRANSPORTATION & DEVELOPMENT

- Completed \$10 million street resurfacing program (20.7 miles on 37 streets) funded by Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST)
- Completed 14 mid-block pedestrian crossings with refuge islands near MARTA bus stops to improve safety
- Completed bridge repair off East Conley Road
 over Conley Creek in 130 days





ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- \$3 million in American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) Small Business Grant Program to help business sustain and grow
- Hired a Project Manager to spearhead business retention and expansion recognizing industry needs
- Implemented \$3 Million ARPA Small Business Grant Program issuing funds to help Clayton County businesses sustain and grow
- Implemented round two ARPA Grant Program to fund eligible non-profit organizations in Clayton County, GA with \$500,000 in grants for 58 non-profit organizations
- Large Redevelopment of the Year Award Finalist for the 2022 Metro Atlanta Redevelopment Summit (Clayton County Public Schools Arena Project)
- Clayton County was awarded the largest Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) Livable Centers Initiative (LCI) Grant in 2022 for \$400,000 (Tara Gateway Study)
- Launched the first Small Business Open House during National Economic Development Week featuring these Small Business lenders and partners
- Silver Award recipient of International Economic Development Council (IEDC) for multi-media video production highlighting assets in the county







FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES

- Accredited agency status with the Commission on Fire Accreditation International (CFAI)
- Responded to nearly 53,000 service calls
- Implemented a Mentorship Program for more positive work environment and better employee engagement
- Capital Projects: Fire Stations 1, 2, 9, 13, and 15
- Fire Headquarters Community Clinic
- New Clayton County Cares (4C) Program for equitable access to healthcare





DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

- Issued \$113,900,000 in bond financing for Clorox, Clayton State University, Rock Hill Logistic Center and Freedom Landing Logistic Center Projects
- Assisted the Clayton County Board of Commissioners with over \$11 million in SPLOST funded projects for the construction of the Gilbert Road Project and the Business Incubator Project
- Implementation of Workforce Development
 Programs
- Lowered unemployment rate from 13.8% to 4.00% (More than \$800 million in restored income to our homes, families and businesses)
- Increased medium household income from \$49,000 in 2019 to \$61,523 in 2022

PROBATE COURT

- Resumed the Pro Bono Clinic and free 30-minute consultation
- Revamped training materials and resumed regular staff training
- Reduced the processing time for petitions and completed most cases within 30–90 days from the date of filing
- Successfully recruited and retained quality clerks and reduced the vacancies and turnover rate for the court









POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Implemented The Fusus Program (Real-Time Crime Center)
- Hired 29 Police Academy Recruits
- Created Joint Crime Suspension Taskforce (C.A.G.E. Unit) with other municipalities
- Provided First Aid training, medical bag, and Automated External Defibrillators (AED) to all police officers

CORRECTIONS DEPARTMENT

- Conducted successful Trash Amnesty Events in March 2022 (4 days) and collected more than 364 tons of trash
- Grass cutting, dead animal removal, litter removal and disposal on more than 740 miles of Georgia highways and county roads
- Successfully resolved 12,174 case concerns on 13,021 total cases and conducted 130 community blitzes citing or warning residents or business owners



OFFICE OF COMMUNICATIONS

- Developed and implemented a new podcast studio and launched the inaugural Clayton Connected Podcast episode featuring the county's Strategic Plan
- Vaccinate Clayton campaign: Increased the number of fully vaccinated residents by 10% (from 39% to 50%) in 2022 in the Vaccinate Clayton communications campaign in partnership with Department of Public Health and Fire and Emergency Services
- Launched mid-year Vaccinate Clayton
 communications/marketing strategy featuring
 senior citizens who share their statements on
 why they chose to take the COVID-19 vaccine
- Installed new digitized print services copiers and upgraded equipment to expand and enhance service capabilities
- Earned the top Public Relations Society of America (PRSA) Georgia Phoenix Award for the Most Effective In-House Marketing Campaign for Spivey Splash Water Park as a premier destination
- Upgraded computers, cameras, and software for more effective development of creative services
- Implemented quarterly staff trainings for best practices in communications, photography, videography, social media, and other creative services











PARKS AND RECREATION

- Exceeded \$1.5 million in the first year of the new Spivey Splash Waterpark
- Added an additional Dog Park in District 1
- Held four Sip & Sound Concerts
- Planted over 300 trees in collaboration with Trees Atlanta
- Conducted national background checks on all coaches to enured all children are safe
- Increased the Clayton Connects Trail system by 1.5 miles with plans to increase to over 20 miles by the end of 2023
- Increased minimum wage for all park employees to \$15.11 per hour

- Began \$40 million county administration building design
- Oversaw renovation, reconstruction, and completed upgrades for the new Spivey Splash Water Park
- Updated parking lot lighting at Charlie Griswell Senior Center and Virginia Gray Recreation Center
- Began construction on new fire station 1, 9, 13, and 15
- Completed move-in to the new Public
 Defender Office
- Completed upgrades to Shelnut Senior Center/Kinship Program for Grandparents Raising Grandchildren
- Multiple facility enhancements to the Reynold's Nature Center
- Updated and issued a new employee handbook

TAX ASSESSORS

- Tax digest increased \$1.2 billion (2021-2022)
- Won appeal with the Department of Audits on 2021 Sales Ratio (Above 38)
- Increased taxable value of \$2.1 million
- Appeals decreased by 565 (from 5,317 to 4,753)
- Completed all appeals since the pandemic
- Fully staffed for the first time in three years

- Partnership with Clayton County Public Schools for General Education Diploma (GED), English as Second Language (ESL) classes, and an exceptional student program
- New Bookmobile for the community
- Presented Planning for Collections Diversity Audit at Georgia Library Association Conference
- Purchased translation devices for non-English speaking members to have real-time conversations









CENTRAL SERVICES

- Earned the National Procurement Institute (NPI)
 Achievement of Excellence in Procurement Award
 2022, which recognizes organizational excellence in
 public procurement by measuring the procurement
 organization's innovation, professionalism, productivity,
 e-procurement, and leadership attributes
- Implemented an electronic online bid system for an easy and accessible way to view and submit BID documents and quotes to the county
- Created and launched the county's Mentor Protégé Program (MPP) Cohort for Construction, which helps eligible Small Local Businesses gain capacity through partnerships with more experienced companies



UGA EXTENSION

- Director Rebecca Hardeman earned national recipe development award and invitation to present in Canada
- Distributed over 500 pounds of food at the Powerhouse Produce Party
- 4-H memberships increased from 217 to 1,289
- Most active 4-H camping season in over 5 years
- Summer activities increased by 300%

- National Research Project participant: 1 of 4 senior services departments in the US selected to address the National Council on Aging and American Society of Aging on obesity
- Hosted the 2nd Annual State of Georgia Golden Olympics swim meet in collaboration with Clayton County Parks and Recreation
- Hosted the 2nd Annual county-wide Vet Connect Event serving over 350 Veterans in Clayton County





OFFICE OF YOUTH SERVICES

- 24 high school scholars were sworn in as 2022-2023 Youth Commissioners
- Awarded \$100,000 in grant funds from HUD to develop a cybersecurity and coding boot camp in partnership with Information Technology Services
- Career, Technical, Agricultural, and Education (CTAE) partnership to introduce students to E-911, Cybersecurity, and Emergency Management
