December Veteran of The Month *Captain Olivia E. Smith, PhD,*



Captain Olivia E. Smith, PhD, is a licensed social worker with over 30 years of clinical and administrative experience in behavioral health, military health, and other health-related programs. She served as a Captain, medical officer, and Chief of Family Advocacy in the United States Air Force during Desert Storm. Dr. Smith has a personal and professional interest in program planning and policy development as it relates to the health care of United States veterans and their families. Presently, Dr. Smith advocates and empowers male and female veterans to obtain benefits and services to improve their quality of life with respect and dignity. Her passion is to serve women veterans. Dr. Smith's work as a pioneer, humanitarian, and veteran advocate exemplifies her devotion to promoting the welfare of veterans. Her special determination is the elimination of many service blockages that tend to cause veterans to experience undue pain and suffering.

While serving in the military, Dr. Smith incurred a chronic illness that greatly affected her physical health. She utilizes her personal journey with the

Department of Veterans Affairs to serve as a tireless volunteer. Presently, she advocates for veterans, families, and significant others. Dr. Smith commits her unrelenting efforts to make a difference in the lives of veterans by assisting with information sharing related to Post Traumatic Stress Syndrome (PTSD), Military Sexual Trauma (MST) for men and women, homelessness, health/disabilities, financial support, education, burial, and other benefits.

Dr. Smith is a lifelong member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Disabled American Veterans (DAV) and longstanding member of the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) and National Association of Social Workers, Georgia Chapter and Georgia Military Women which includes women veterans from all branches of the military. The Community networks and empowers women to obtain the "*Quality of Life*" that was fought for, sacrificed for, and rightfully earned as honorably discharged female veterans.

Dr. Smith's scholastic achievements include a Master of Social Work degree from Howard University in Washington, D. C., and holds a Doctor of Philosophy in Social Work.

Dr. Smith, a disabled veteran and social worker, is a pioneer who provides unyielding time and efforts to serve her country and advocate for veterans' rights and services. She demonstrates a determination to be a change agent in the community and to affect the lives of veterans, who swore to give their lives to serve and protect the country and us. "Helpful Hints to Keep Your Pets Safe this Christmas"!

- 1. Stocking Stuffers for Pets: It's important to ensure that your pet doesn't eat all the treats in their stocking at once. This can lead to digestive problems and make them sick.
- 2. Tinsel & Ribbons: The sparkle on the Christmas tree and ribbons on gifts are beautiful to look at, but it's important to clean them up off the floor. Our dogs and cats can be curious and may want to eat them, which can cause serious stomach and intestinal damage.
- 3. Salt-Dough & Homemade Play-Dough Ornaments: These DIY ornaments contain a high level of salt which could be toxic for pets if ingested.
- 4. Holiday Plants: Please be aware that Poinsettias may irritate your pet's mouth and stomach leading to drooling, vomiting, and even diarrhea. Mistletoe is another plant that can cause your pet to vomit and have diarrhea, and other possible symptoms include difficulty breathing, a slowed heart rate, low blood pressure, and odd behavior. Although Holly berries and their leaves aren't too harmful, they can still make your pet feel sick.
- 5. Table Scraps: It's not a good idea to feed your pet with table scraps that are high in fat, such as fat trimmings or chicken/turkey skin from a roast. These types of foods can cause stomach problems for your pet and may result in a serious illness known as pancreatitis.
- 6. Human Treats & Alcohol: It's essential to know that chocolate can be harmful to your cat or dog. However, it's not just chocolate that could pose a danger to your furry friend. Mints that contain xylitol can be harmful too. This ingredient is also present in candy, chewing gum, certain kinds of peanut butter, and baked goods. Alcohol consumption can make your pet feel unwell, causing vomiting, diarrhea, weakness, difficulty breathing, incoordination, shaking, and in severe cases, respiratory failure leading to death.
- 7. Snack Bags: Dogs have a natural inclination to sniff out any food item that is lying around, including potato chips and cereal bags. However, if a dog puts his head inside one of these bags and inhales, it can lead to suffocation. Therefore, it is essential to pick up these bags and dispose of them properly in the trash.







