January Veteran of The Month US Army Staff Sergeant Judith Lynne Cotten

Staff Sergeant Judith Lynne Cotten was born on October 30, 1961, in Bedford Stuyvesant "BedStuy", Brooklyn, New York to Lester and Lillian Cotten.

In June 1979, Judy graduated from high school, attended college, and gave birth to her son Dequan on September 20, 1980. Unfortunately, the "crack epidemic" plagued New York which led her to join the U.S. Army in November 1980. 


