- 1. Must complete Notice of Candidacy
- 2. Must complete a Paupers Affidavit
- 3. Must submit a completed Qualifying Petition at the time of qualifying, signed by one percent of the total number of voters eligible to vote in the last election for filling of the office for which the candidate is qualifying. Refer to the Chart on page 5 for the number of signatures required for a Qualifying Petition.
- 4. The Paupers affidavit, Notice of Candidacy and Qualifying Petition must be filed at time of qualifying. The Qualifying petition may be circulated within 180 days of the last day the qualifying petition may be filed. The earliest day to circulate a Petition to qualify as a Pauper is September 6, 2023.
