Dear Clayton County Community,



February Veteran of The Month Chief Master Sgt. Betty J. Abraham





"Celebrating African American" Excellence

Henry O. Flipper, Engineer


Henry Ossian Flipper rose to fame as the first African American graduate of the United States Military Academy at West Point. He was assigned to the 10th U.S. Calvary Regiment after graduating from West Point. The 10th Calvary Regiment was one of the only all-Black regiments in the U.S. Army. They were popularly known as the Buffalo Soldiers. The Buffalo Soldiers played a role in the development of the American West. The Buffalo Soldiers were split up and integrated into other units, in 1951.

Henry O. Flipper is best known for what is called the Flipper's Ditch. He was a capable engineer, and this "Flipper's Ditch" is what he is best known for. It is a drainage system that at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, minimized malaria by eliminating standing water.

Henry was charged with misappropriating government funds while assigned to a unit in Fort Davis, Texas. His military career was cut short when he was court-martialed and acquitted on September 17, 1881. Flipper was later discharged on June 30, 1882, from the Army.

Flipper held various positions as a civil mining engineer, surveyor, translator, and historian, after leaving the military. He eventually moved to Atlanta in 1931 at the age of 75 years old. He passed in Atlanta, Georgia in 1940. President Jimmy Carter granted Henry O. Flipper an Honorable discharge in 1976. To follow was a presidential pardon by President Bill Clinton in 1999.







> Hours of Operation: Monday – Friday 8:00 am – 4:00 pm

Refuse Control is a service provided by Clayton County for residents located in the unincorporated area of Clayton County. This department handles the disposal of certain items that your waste removal company may not pick up.

Refuse Control will pick up yard debris, furniture, appliances, limbs (up to 6" in diameter and no longer than 10 feet), bags of leaves, and miscellaneous items. The following items will <u>not</u> be accepted: tree trunks or stumps, batteries, tires, shingles, sheetrock, bricks, heavy metal, heavy items, mulch, dirt, paint cans, or hazardous items.

Debris Removal:

- Place items to be picked up by the curb on the county's right of way.
- For an inspector to come out to give you an estimate, call Refuse Control at (770) 477-3548.
 (Estimate is at no charge.)
- Debris removal fee is assessed by our inspectors based on the amount and type of debris and the amount of time to load and unload

the debris. However, there is a minimum fee of \$20.00 that will be charged. Payment of fee constitutes acceptance of price. Should you decide to use the County's service, payment can be done in one of four ways:

- Call the office and pay with Visa or MasterCard. (check cards will be accepted if it has a Visa or MasterCard logo)
- Come by the office with cash, check, or money order.
- 3. Mail in check or money order.

Other Services:

Refuse Control also picks up dead animals from the roads. For live wild/stray animals in the road, please call Animal Control (770) 477-3509 and report the location.

LEVEL 1: Register Your Cameras

Let's work together to fight crime! Register your security cameras with Connect Clayton County today to help identify area cameras in case of an incident. An investigator from the Clayton County Police Department will contact you via email if they need your assistance solving a crime near you.

Camera registration takes less than one minute via our secure online portal. Registering your cameras does not allow the Clayton County Police Department access to your live video stream - it only enables investigators to know a camera is present at your location and easily request video evidence should an incident occur.





Businesses and residents can take community security one step further by giving the Clayton County Police Department direct access to your camera feed in case of a nearby emergency.


All you need is a small CORE device that you plug into your camera system.






