# APRIL Veteran of The Month Master Sergeant Wayne Collins







Wayne Collins enlisted in the United States Army in Atlanta, Georgia in October of 1976 and was assigned to the United States Army Signal School at Fort Gordon, Georgia. 

### Do You Stretch Daily?

#### Here are some reasons why you should STRETCH!

- 1. Bright-Eyed & Ready To Go: Taking a stretch break during the day will revitalize you. Just a few minutes of stretching will refresh you faster than the time it takes to throw together a latte. Plus, the stretching increases blood flow throughout your body and your brain, it wakes you up and helps you feel energetic.
- 2. Less Likely to Fall: Researchers based on a study, think that stretching could assist in fine-muscle coordination. So, the overall idea is if a person stretches they may be able to avoid tripping or falling.
- 3. Move Around Better & Less Pain: If you stretch regularly it can relieve tight muscles and rigid joints. Stretches that are not static, but that go through the full range of motion are best for this like for example shoulder shrugs, wrist bends, and knee lifts.
- 4. Make the Most of Your Work-Out: Stretching pre- and post-workout should be a part of your routine to help increase your range of motion and flexibility. Dynamic stretching, which is movements where your joints and your muscles go through a full -range of motion, is best at the beginning of your workout to warm up your body and increase joint flexibility. Static stretching is a stretch where you hold a single position for a period of time, and this type of stretching is best at the end of your workout.
- 5. Less Likely to Get Hurt: Stretching during your warm-up helps your body get ready for exercise and helps your brain know it's time to work out. This will help you focus, so then you are less likely to make a misstep and hurt yourself.
- 6. May Lower Blood Sugar: It is well known that exercise helps keep glucose levels in check. A study in 2011 done with adults who had type 2 diabetes or were prediabetic found that the subjects who stretched for 40 minutes after drinking a sugary beverage had lower blood sugar levels than those subjects who just stayed in the same position. So, it looks like the benefit of lowering your glucose levels just might kick in before you even break a sweat.
- 7. Stress Less: Stretching can help subdue your tensions both physically and mentally, as it alleviates tight muscles it tricks you into feeling more peaceful, relaxed, and less stressed.



# **KEEP YOUR DOG CONTAINED**

## If it is outside the house: leash it or fence it.

In Clayton County, Georgia, it is the law that all dogs must be contained and under the contro of its owner whenever it is outside its home. That means on a leash or within a fenced yard. Respect your neighbors and their property.

Dogs picked up wandering loose will be impounded at Clayton County Animal Control.

To reclaim your dog, you will need to provide proof of ownership, current rabies vaccination certificate, and proof that the dog is spayed or neutered.

If unable to provide appropriate proof of vaccination or sterilization surgery, then additional fees may be charged.

Refuse Control is a service provided by Clayton County for residents located in the unincorporated area of Clayton County. This department handles the disposal of certain items that your waste removal company may not pick up.

Refuse Control will pick up yard debris, furniture, appliances, limbs (up to 6" in diameter and no longer than 10 feet), bags of leaves, and miscellaneous items. The following items will <u>not</u> be accepted: tree trunks or stumps, batteries, tires, shingles, sheetrock, bricks, heavy metal, heavy items, mulch, dirt, paint cans, or hazardous items.

#### Debris Removal:


- Place items to be picked up by the curb on the county's right of way.
- For an inspector to come out to give you an estimate, call Refuse Control at (770) 477-3548.
   (Estimate is at no charge.)
- Debris removal fee is assessed by our inspectors based on the amount and type of debris and the amount of time to load and unload

the debris. However, there is a minimum fee of \$20.00 that will be charged. Payment of fee constitutes acceptance of price. Should you decide to use the County's service, payment can be done in one of four ways:

- Call the office and pay with Visa or MasterCard. (check cards will be accepted if it has a Visa or MasterCard logo)
- Come by the office with cash, check, or money order.
- 3. Mail in check or money order.

#### Other Services:

Refuse Control also picks up dead animals from the roads. For live wild/stray animals in the road, please call Animal Control (770) 477-3509 and report the location.


